Nursery Home Learning

Below are some activities that you can complete at home with your children.


Read a book with a grown up. Talk
about what happened in the story.
What was your favourite part? Why?

Use child scissors to cut different materials e.g. cards, paper, greaseproof paper, tissues, kitchen roll, cardboard tubes, foil, straws

Take obscure photos of objects around your home and encourage your child to find where they are, for example, a close-up photo of a bath plug hole, a close-up photo of a cheese grater, or carpet, bed sheet, drying rack, etc.

Bake some tasty treats e.g. cakes, biscuits etc. (This is a great opportunity to include maths counting, weighing etc.)

Freeze some plastic animals or dinosaurs in water. How can you rescue them? What could you use? How quickly does the ice melt?



Follow the link below and watch the animals on the webcams. What animals did you see? Make a list and draw some pictures of the animals you saw.

Put a coat hanger on a door handle. Attach a plastic bag/small bucket on each side of the coat hanger and you've made a balance. Invite your

Another way of playing the game is


to cover the things, take one thing

Create some models using junk. What will you build? A house, a castle, a car, a lorry, an animal...

Practise washing your hands properly using to actions from the song to help you.

Find things out from books or use the internet to find out about things your child is interested in.

Talk with your child about what you have found. Encourage your child to make their own non-fiction book about something they're interested in, for example animals, superheroes, space, unicorns, transport and so on.
